PREPARING FOR 2023

2023 OFFERING ENVELOPES GETTING CREDIT FOR YOUR OFFERINGS

The **2023 offering envelopes** will be on a table in the Narthex starting Sunday, December 4, 2022 through January 1, 2023. Please stop by and pick up your envelope box at your convenience.



Donations are effective only in the year in which they are offered. A check received after December 31, 2022 cannot be credited for the 2022 year even if it is dated "2022." Make sure your **mailing envelope is postmarked by December 31, 2022.** Then, even if it arrives in 2023, the check is still deductible for 2022.

The **best way to make sure your offerings are credited** to your account is to use the Good Shepherd numbered offering envelopes assigned to you. Using your assigned offering envelopes helps the offering tabulators and myself for record-keeping purposes and posting to the correct accounts.

Also available for your convenience is **online VANCO** giving through the new Realm software. See the article in this month's issue to further explain how to sign up.

When completing your contribution, please do the following:

- 1. Use your assigned general offering envelopes or a pink special envelope. The pink special envelopes are located in the pews and on the table in front of the Chapel. If using a pink special envelope, please indicate which fund the contribution is to be applied.
- 2. Write your name on the envelope.
- 3. Write the amount on the envelope.


NEW WAY OF ONLINE GIVING THROUGH VANCO USING REALM SOFTWARE


We in the church office have been working diligently to learn the new Realm software. We are now ready to offer a change to our online giving. This will still be handled by Vanco but you will no longer need to go through the Vanco website and log in.


You will be able to use a link provided by the church office and set up a recurring transaction or make a one-time donation. Once a new reoccurring transaction is set up, you will need to go back to the Vanco site one more time to STOP the recurring transaction used on their website.

When you click the link to make a donation, you will need to select the fund where you are donating the money. (ex. General Offering, Memorial, Altar Flowers, or Seasonal Flowers) On the next screen, you will select which form of payment to use. *You may also select to add an amount to help with the processing fee of this transaction.* It is a minimal fee but adds to what the church currently pays for this service.

LECTIONARY FOR DECEMBER 2022

DECEMBER 4—SECOND SUNDAY OF ADVENT

At the heart of our Advent preparation stands John the Baptist, who calls us to repent and make a new beginning. As the darkness increases we turn toward the approaching light of Christ. For Christians he is the root of Jesse, the righteous judge who welcomes all, especially the poor and meek of the earth. We wait with hope for that day when the wolf will dwell with the lamb, and there will be no more hurt or destruction. From the Lord's table we are sent in the spirit of John the Baptist to proclaim that in Christ the kingdom of God has come near.

FIRST READING - Isaiah 11:1-10

Isaiah describes the coming of a future, ideal ruler who will renew David's royal line (the stump of Jesse). Gifted by the spirit of God, this ruler will reign with perfect justice. Enmity and danger will be restored to harmony and peaceful coexistence.

PSALM - Psalm 72:1-7, 18-19

May the righteous flourish; let there be an abundance of peace. (Ps. 72:7)

SECOND READING - Romans 15:4-13

God's promise to include Gentiles within the circle of God's blessed people has been fulfilled in Jesus Christ. Christians live out their unity by welcoming and encouraging each other just as Christ has welcomed them into God's family.

GOSPEL - Matthew 3:1-12

Just before Jesus begins his public ministry, John the Baptist appears, calling people to mend their ways and speaking of a powerful one who is to come.

DECEMBER 11—THIRD SUNDAY OF ADVENT

A note of joyful expectation marks today's worship. Isaiah announces that the desert shall rejoice and blossom, and Jesus points to the unexpected and transforming signs of God's reign. We wait with patience for the coming of the Lord, even as we rejoice at his presence among us this day: in word and holy supper, in church and in our homes, in silent reflection and in works of justice and love. We pray that God would open our eyes and ears to the wonders of Christ's advent among us.

FIRST READING - Isaiah 35:1-10

The prophet describes the return from the Babylonian captivity as a joyous procession to Zion. God's coming reign will bring a renewal of creation in which health and wholeness will be restored. There is no need for fear, for God is coming to save.

PSALM - Luke 1:46b-55

My spirit rejoices in God my Savior. (Lk. 1:47)

SECOND READING - James 5:7-10

In anticipation of the Lord's coming, Christians are called upon to cultivate patience rather than discontent.

GOSPEL - Matthew 11:2-11

John the Baptist expects the Messiah to bring God's judgment upon the earth (Matt. 3:11-12). From a prison cell, he wonders whether Jesus is the one who will do this. Jesus' response indicates that God's reign is indeed being fulfilled already through healing and restoration.

DECEMBER 18—FOURTH SUNDAY OF ADVENT

Today Isaiah prophesies that a young woman will bear a son and name him Emmanuel. The gospel is Matthew's account of the annunciation and birth of the one named Emmanuel, God-with-us. During these final days of Advent we pray, "O come, O come, Emmanuel," a beloved hymn based on the O Antiphons, ancient prayers appointed for the seven days preceding Christmas. On this final Sunday of Advent we prepare to celebrate the birth of the one born to save us from the power of sin and death.

FIRST READING - Isaiah 7:10-16

An Israelite and Aramean military coalition presented a serious threat to King Ahaz of Judah. In response, Ahaz decided to secure his throne and kingdom by seeking Assyrian help. Isaiah reminds Ahaz that human attempts to establish security will fail. The prophet gives the sign that is the only source of true safety: Immanuel, God is with us!

PSALM - Psalm 80:1-7, 17-19

Let your face shine upon us, and we shall be saved. (Ps. 80:7)

SECOND READING - Romans 1:1-7

Most of the Christians in Rome do not know Paul. In this letter's opening he introduces himself as an apostle divinely appointed to spread God's gospel. The gospel's content is the promised coming of Christ, and Paul's mission is to bring about the obedience of faith among all nations, including his Roman audience.

GOSPEL - Matthew 1:18-25

Matthew's story of Jesus' birth focuses on the role of Joseph, who adopts the divinely-begotten child into the family of David and obediently gives him the name Jesus, which means "God saves."

DECEMBER 25—CHRISTMAS DAY

As on the first day of creation, on this Christmas Day the Word illumines the world, shining forth to bring all things into being. Today we celebrate the incarnate Word, God becoming flesh to live among us in the person of Jesus Christ then and now. Emboldened by the good news of Christ's birth, along with the shepherds, Mary and Joseph, and all witnesses to the light of Christ, we declare to the world that we have indeed seen and been transformed by the arrival of "the salvation of our God." O come, let us adore!

FIRST READING - Isaiah 52:7-10

Isaiah proclaims news of great joy: "Your God reigns!" Just as God saved the people from oppression in Egypt, God delivers Israel from exile. All the earth will witness the saving acts of God.

PSALM - Psalm 98

All the ends of the earth have seen the victory of our God. (Ps. 98:3)

SECOND READING - Hebrews 1:1-12

This letter opens with a lofty declaration of Jesus' preeminent status as the Son through whom God created the world and through whom our sins are cleansed. God speaks to us now through the Son, who is exalted even above the angels.

GOSPEL - John 1:1-14

The prologue to the Gospel of John describes Jesus as the Word of God made flesh, the one who reveals God to be "full of grace and truth."


